To the very indigent, who are objects of parochial care, the Dispensary does not profess to extend aid. It would afford means of alleviation from suffering and recovery from illness to a class of persons most deserving of sympathy, who could not, in case of distress, be sent to the Commissioner for the Poor. For such an object, the Committee trust, earnest solicitation will not be required to obtain the small amount which each year may be required.
