And whereas an arrangement for facilitating the transmission of Books and Pamphlets between Great Britain and this Province has been sanctioned by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and by Her Majesty's Postmaster General, His Excellency in Council hereby orders that all Books and Pamphlets may, from and after the second day of January, 1854, be transmitted to and from the United Kingdom on the terms and in the manner specified in this Order: And His Excellency in Council further orders that no Inland Postage be charged within this Province on any Book or Pamphlet duly posted in pursuance of such arrangement and in conformity therewith.

Postage of Printed Books, Magazines, Reviews and Pamphlets, to and from the United Kingdom and New Brunswick-

For each packet not exceeding 1 th in weight, - - Six pence, Sterling.

Do. exceeding 11b and not exceeding 11b, One shilling, do.

Do. exceeding 11b and not exceeding 21b, Two shillings, do.

Do. exceeding 21b and not exceeding 31b, Three shillings, do. And so on, increasing one shilling for every additional pound, or fraction of a pound.
