A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of this Province, made and passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act in amendment of the Law relating to Inland Posts," His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor in Council was authorized to carry out, by Order in Council duly made and published in the Royal Gazette, any arrangements from time to time made for facilitating the transmission of Books and Pamphlets, or for reducing the rate of Postage on Letters between Great Britain and the Colonies, which might be sanctioned by Her Majesty's Postmaster General, or by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and to regulate the transmission by Post from one part of the Colony to the other, of all such Books or Pamphlets on such terms and in such manner as to His Excellency in Council should seem meet;

And whereas an arrangement for facilitating the transmission of Books and Pamphlets between Great Britain and this Province has been sanctioned by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and by Her Majesty's Postmaster General, His Excellency in Council hereby orders that all Books and Pamphlets may, from and after the second day of January, 1854, be transmitted to and from the United Kingdom on the terms and in the manner specified in this Order: And His Excellency in Council further orders that no Inland Postage be charged within this Province on any Book or Pamphlet duly posted in pursuance of such arrangement and in conformity therewith.

Postage of Printed Books, Magazines, Reviews and Pamphlets, to and from the United Kingdom and New Brunswick—
