To His Excellency the Lieucenent Governor or Administrator of the Covern-

An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the services therein mentioned. Passed 3rd May 1853.

E it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, as follows:-

as follows:—

1. There be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this Province, the following sums, to wit:-

The sum of twenty four pounds be granted and paid into the Casual Revenue in payment of a grant of land to William, James, Susan, Jeremiah, Robert, George and Elizabeth M'Cluskey, children of the late William and Elizabeth M'Cluskey, the latter of whom fell a victim to the fury of William Karrigan, a lunatic, in the Parish of Westfield, in King's County, in the year one thousand

eight hundred and fifty one.

To the Governor and Trustees of the Madras School the sum of four hundred Madras Schools. pounds towards the support of that institution.

To the Trustees of the Wesleyan Academy at Mount Allison, Sackville, the Wesleyan sum of three hundred pounds towards the support of that institution.

To the Managing Committee of the Baptist Seminary in Fredericton the sum Baptist Seminary. of two hundred and fifty pounds towards the support of that institution.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Government for the time being, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds towards the support of the Roman Catholic School established in the City of Saint John.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Government for the time being, the sum of thirty pounds, in aid of individual subscription, towards the Free School in the Parish of Portland; the same to be expended by the Board of Commissioners of the Roman Catholic School in Saint John.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Govern- Distressed Indians. ment for the time being, a sum not exceeding two hundred and fifty pounds, to be applied in relieving sick and distressed Indians in this Province, and for procuring Seed Grain and Potatoes.

To Jacob Kollock, an old Soldier of the Revolutionary War, the sum of fifteen J. Kollock, relief. pounds to aid him in his present destitute circumstances.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or Administrator of the Govern- J. Dixon, relief. ment for the time being, the sum of six pounds to enable Joseph Dixon to pay for a lot of land on which he now resides.

To the Commissioners of sick and disabled Seamen for the Port of Bathurst, Seamen's Hospital, the sum of one hundred pounds to enable them to build a Seamen's Hospital at said Port.

To the Commissioners of the Alms House and Work House for the City and Distressed Emi-County of Saint John, the sum of two hundred and twenty pounds fifteen shillings and nine pence to reimburse expenses incurred in support and relief of sick and distressed Emigrants at that establishment during the past year; and also the further sum of thirty six pounds two shillings and nine pence to reimburse
