COLONIAL CHURCH REGULATION.

A Bill as amended on report on re-commitment, and read a third time, entituled—" An Act to enable the Bishops, Clergy, and Laity of the United Church of England and Ireland in Her Majesty's Foreign and Colonial Possessions to provide for the Regulation of the Affairs of the said Church in such Possessions."

Whereas by reason of the laws in force for restraining and regulating assemblies of the clergy of the United Church of England and Ireland, and other laws and usages having special reference to the authority and privileges of the said Church as established in England and Ireland respectively, doubts are entertained whether the members of such Church in colonial dioceses are not disabled from assembling for the management of their
