WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands
prorogued to Tuesday the eighth day of August next, I
have thought fit to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the
same is hereby prorogued to Tuesday the nineteenth day of Sep-
tember next.

thirty first day of July, in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and fifty four, and in the
eighteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Pro-
vince of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly
of the said Province, did in the month of May 1854, pass an Act,
which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 2299. An Act to amend the Acts relating to the European
and North American Railway Company.

And whereas the said Act has been referred to the Committee
of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council
appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and
Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their
opinion to Her Majesty, that the said Act should receive Her
Majesty's special confirmation, Her Majesty was thereupon this
day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare
her special confirmation of the said Act, and the same is hereby
specially confirmed, ratified, and finally enacted accordingly;
Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in
Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brun-
swick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice
and govern themselves accordingly.

SIR,—I have the honor of transmitting to you copy of a Com-
munication which Her Majesty's Government have just received
from the Minister of the United States at this Court, enclosing a
Despatch from the Department of State at Washington, by which
it appears that the President's ratification of the Reciprocity Treaty
will be ready to be exchanged against that of Her Majesty, when
the latter arrives at Washington; and that the Congress has already
passed a Law to give effect to that Treaty. Mr. Marcy also ex-
presses the hope of the Government of the United States, that
American fishermen may not be molested if they should at once
attempt to use the privileges secured to them by the Treaty.

It is the desire of Her Majesty's Government that this wish of
the Government of the United States should be acceded to, and
that American fishermen may be immediately allowed the use of
these privileges.

Her Majesty's ratification will be sent by this Mail, to be ex-
changed against that of the President of the United States, by Her
Majesty's Minister at Washington.
