A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is probable that England and France may be involved in hostilities, and may be called on to act in strict union and alliance for purposes offensive and defensive against Russia, I do hereby require and enjoin all Officers or Servants of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, and all Her Majesty's Subjects of the Province of New Brunswick, to afford to French Subjects and French Commerce, protection and aid similar to that which they are bound to afford to the Subjects and Commerce of Great Britain and Ireland; and I do hereby command them for the purposes aforesaid, to co-operate zealously and efficiently with Her Majesty's Naval Forces.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the twenty first day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four, and in the seventeenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
