Corn Broom Brush; Indian Corn; Rice, ground and unground; Eggs; Manures of all kinds; Oil, Blubber, Fins and Skins, the produce of creatures living in the Sea, the return of Vessels fitted out in this Province for fishing voyages; Plants, Shrubs, and Trees; Rags; Wood and Lumber of all kinds, (except Cedar, Spruce, Pine, and Hemlock Shingles.)

CAP. III.

An Act to relieve certain Articles from the payment of Duty.

Passed 3rd November 1854.

WHEREAS it is desirable to relieve certain Articles hereafter imported into this Province from the payment and collection of any Duty or Duties imposed by any Act or Acts now in force;

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, That from and after the passing of this Act, the Articles hereinafter enumerated, shall and may be imported free from all duty, for and notwithstanding any Act or Law now in force to the contrary, that is to say:—Molasses, Grain, Flour, Meal, and Salted and Cured Meats of all kinds.
