## A PROCLAMATION.

IS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to order and direct, that pending the completion of any further measures required to give entire effect to the Reciprocity Treaty recently concluded between Great Britain and the United States, the several Articles mentioned in the Schedule to the Act passed in the last Session of the Legislature of this Province, intituled "An Act for giving effect on the part of the Province of New Brunswick to a certain Treaty between Her Majesty and the United States of America," hereinafter enumerated, that is to say-

Grain, Flour, and Breadstuffs of all kinds. Animals of all kinds. Fresh, Smoked, and Salted Meats. Cotton Wool, Seeds, and Vegetables. Undried Fruits, Dried Fruits. Fish of all kinds. Products of Fish and all other creatures living in the water. Poultry, Eggs. Hides, Furs, Skins, or Tails, undressed. Stone or Marble in its crude or unwrought state. Slate. Butter, Cheese, and Tallow. Lard, Horns, Manures. Ores of Metals of all kinds. Coal. Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Ashes. Timber and Lumber of all kinds, round, hewed, and sawed, unmanufactured in whole or in part. Firewood, Plants, Shrubs, and Trees. Pelts, Wool. Fish Oil. Rice, Broom Corn, and Bark. Gypsum, ground or unground. Hewn or wrought or unwrought Burr or Grindstones. Dye Stuffs. Flax, Hemp, and Tow, unmanufactured. Unmanufactured Tobacco.

List of Articles enumerated in the Reciprocity Treaty which are exempted from all Duty on importation, by Chapter 14 of the Revised Statutes, viz :--

Corn Broom Brush; Indian Corn; Rice, ground and unground; Eggs; Manures of all kinds; Oil, Blubber, Fins, and Skins, the produce of creatures living in the Sea, the return of Vessels fitted out in this Province for fishing voyages; Plants, Shrubs, and Trees; Rags; Wood and Lumber of all kinds, (except Cedar, Spruce, Pine and Hemlock Shingles.)

An Act to relieve certain Articles from the payment of Duty. Passed 3rd November 1854.

WHEREAS it is desirable to relieve certain Articles hereafter imported into this Province from the payment and collection of any Duty or Duties imposed by any Act or Acts now in force;

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, That from and after the passing of this Act, the Articles hereinafter enumerated, shall and may be imported free from all duty, for and nothwithstanding any Act or Law now in force to the contrary, that is to say :- Molasses, Grain, Flour, Meal, and Salted and Cured Meats of all kinds.

## OFFICIAL NOTICE UNDER PATENT LAW.

TOTICE is hereby given, That Henry Montower Tibbits, Administrator of the Goods, Chattels and Credits of Benjamin Franklin Tibbits, late of Canning, Queen's County, deceased, has petitioned the Lieutenant Governor in Council for an extension to him, as Administrator aforesaid, of the term of the Patent granted to the said B. F.
