THE Encenia was this day celebrated in the usual manner, the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Fredericton presiding in the unavoidable absence of the Chancellor.

The Commemorative Oration in praise of the Founders and Benefactors of the University was delivered by the Principal.

The President, in the Chancellor's name, proposed for the subject of Essays in competition for the Douglas Gold Medal of the ensuing year:—

"The past History and present Prospects of the Turkish Empire."

The College is indebted to Doctor Martyn Paine, Professor of Materia Medica and Therapeutics in the University of New York, for the presentation to its Library of seven Volumes of his Works, with duplicates of two of the Volumes for the especial benefit of the Students. The Principal has been at the same time requested to present copies of the Works to the Library of the Provincial Legislature.

Mr. John F. Stevenson has been elected University Scholar and Librarian, to enter upon his duties on the first day of next Term.

Michaelmas Term begins on Thursday, September 6th, when Students intending to keep it will attend Divine Service in the College Chapel at 11 A. M. Candidates for Matriculation, or admission to the Lectures in any Department, are desired to appear at 10 A. M. Immediately after Divine Service a Convocation will be held for conferring Degrees, presenting Prizes, and other requisite purposes.
