YORK GENERAL SESSIONS.

JANUARY TERM, A. D. 1855.

ORDERED, That a Special Session shall be held on the second Tuesday in March next, for the purpose of examining into and dealing with the lists of defaulters in the payment of Rates of any kind, under the terms of the Law relating to Rates and Taxes, Chapter 53, Sections 27 and 30 of The Revised Statutes, and of Commissioners and Surveyors of Highways under Chapter 66 of the said Statutes; and that all Justices of the Peace in whose hands any list of defaulters in payment of Rates or performance of Statute Labour shall have been placed for collection, be called upon to make a return of their proceedings thereon at such Sessions; and further, that a copy of this Order be sent by the Clerk within one month from this date, to each Justice of the Peace of the County,

and to each Commissioner, Surveyor, or Collector who shall appear to be a defaulter in paying over moneys collected by him, or otherwise neglecting any duty imposed on them respectively.
