WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of February, March, and April, 1855, pass sixteen Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 2374. An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue towards the Patriotic Fund.

No. 2376. An Act to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the payment of the ordinary services of the Province.

No. 2377. An Act to continue Chapter 34, Title Three, of the Revised Statutes, "Of the payment of Interest on Treasury Warrants."

No. 2378. An Act to continue Chapter 15, Title Three, of the Revised Statutes, "Of the Export Duty on Lumber."

No. 2379. An Act to continue for a further period the Act intituled "An Act to provide for the prompt payment of all demands upon the Provincial Treasury."

No. 2380. An Act for the better supervision and improvement of the Great Roads and Public Works.

No. 2381. An Act to alter the line of the Great Road from Lower Trout Brook Bridge to the Town of Magaguadavic.

No. 2382. An Act concerning Tender in actions at Law and Suits in Equity.

No. 2383. An Act to authorize the opening of a Street from Church Street to Princess Street in the City of Saint John.

No. 2384. An Act to quiet the titles to certain Lands in Queen's County.

No. 2385. An Act to divide the Shire Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, into two separate Districts, for Road and Fire purposes.

No. 2386. An Act in amendment of an Act intituled "An Act to incorporate the South West Boom Company."

No. 2387. An Act further to increase the Capital Stock, and to continue and amend the Act to incorporate the Fredericton Boom Company.

No. 2388. An Act to continue and amend the several Acts relating to the Arestook Boom Company.

No. 2389. An Act to enable the Dorchester Manufacturing Company of the City of New York, to hold property in this Province.

No. 2390. An Act to incorporate the New Brunswick Mining Company.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
