To all to whom these presents shall come—Greeting :

WHEREAS We have been credibly informed that divers Persons have been engaged in plundering the Cargo or effects belonging to the owners, passengers, or crew of the Ship "Lochmaben Castle," stranded on the Bird Island rocks, in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, on or about the fourth day of June last past ; Now KNOW YE, that a REWARD of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, current money of Our Province of Canada, will be paid to any person or persons, not being the actual offenders, who will give such information as shall lead to the discovery, apprehension, and conviction of the perpetrators of the said felony.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said Province to be hereunto affixed : WITNESS, Our Trusty and Well-Beloved SIR EDMUND WALKER HEAD, Baronet, Governor General of British North America, and Captain General and Governor in Chief in and over Our Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and the Island of Prince Edward, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c. At Our Government House, in Our City of Quebec, in Our said Province of Canada, this Third day of August, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty five, and in the nineteenth year of Our Reign.
