To all to whom these presents shall come—Greeting:

HEREAS We have been credibly informed that divers Persons have been engaged in plundering the Cargo or effects belonging to the owners, passengers, or crew of the Ship "Lochmaben Castle," stranded on the Bird Island rocks, in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, on or about the fourth day of June last past; Now Know YE, that a REWARD of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, current money of Our Province of Canada, will be paid to any person or persons, not being the actual offenders, who will give such information as shall lead to the discovery, apprehension, and conviction of the perpetrators of the said felony.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said Province to be hereunto affixed: WITNESS, Our Trusty and Well-Beloved SIR EDMUND WALKER HEAD, Baronet, Governor General of British North America, and Captain General and Governor in Chief in and over Our Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and the Island of Prince Edward, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c. At Our Government House, in Our City of Quebec, in Our said Province of Canada, this Third day of August, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty five, and in the nineteenth year of Our Reign.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty, His Royal Highness Prince ALBERT,

Lord President, Viscount Canning. Sir George Grey, Bt. Duke of Wellington, Marquis of Lansdowne, Mr. Vernon Smith, Viscount Palmerston, Mr. Chancellor of the Exchequer.

THEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of May 1854 and February 1855, pass two Acts which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:-

No. 2367. An Act to revise and consolidate the Public Statutes of New Brunswick.

No. 2375. An Act imposing duties for raising a Revenue.

And whereas the said Acts have been referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, and the said Committee have reported as their opinion to Her Majesty that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
