I have to acquaint you that the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury have decided upon exempting from Income Tax the Dividends payable in this Country upon Loans contracted by Colonial Governments, and held by persons wholly resident in the Colonies to which such Loans belong respectively, upon an application made to the Commissioners of Income Tax accompanied by a Declaration that the Owner of the Stock, upon which such Dividends are payable, is solely resident in such Colony, and that no other person, resident elsewhere, has any interest or share in such Dividends.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

CAPE RACE LIGHT, NEWFOUNDLAND.

The Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade give Notice,—

That the Lighthouse recently erected upon Cape Race (Newfoundland) will be lighted, and will continue to exhibit

A FIXED WHITE LIGHT,

from sunset to sunrise, on and after the Fifteenth of December, 1856.

The light will be visible to seaward from N. E. by E. round by the S. E. and South to West.

The light is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The tower is striped red and white vertically. It stands close to the old beacon, which has been cut down.

The lighthouse is in lat. $46^{\circ} 39' 12''$ N., long. $53^{\circ} 2' 38''$ W.

[All bearings are Magnetic. Var. 24° W.]
