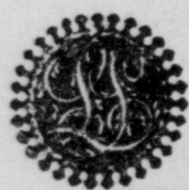

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty ninth day of October instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the tenth day of December next.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the twentieth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven, and in the twenty first year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of July 1857, pass seven Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 2566. An Act to provide for the repair and improvement of the Roads and Bridges, and other Public Works and Services.

No. 2567. An Act to provide for defraying certain expenses of the Civil Government of the Province.

No. 2568. An Act to revive and continue an Act to provide for the expenses of the Legislature.

No. 2569. An Act to amend the first Section of Chapter 19, Title iii, of the Revised Statutes "Of Buoys and Beacons."

No. 2570. An Act to revive and continue Chapters 48, 49, 50, and 51, Title vii, of the Revised Statutes, "Of Parish Schools," and the Act in amendment thereof.

No. 2571. An Act to authorize an increased assessment for the purposes of the Fire Department in the City of Saint John.

No. 2572. An Act for the relief of the Reverend Henry Pitman Guilford.

And whereas the said Acts have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with a letter from the Right Honorable Henry Labouchere, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to the Lord President of the Council, recommending that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said recommendation; Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
