THE Encenia was this day celebrated in the customary form, the Principal presiding in the Convocation.

Professor Jaek delivered the Commemorative Oration; which is expected to be printed for general circulation.

The Senior Student, John Fletcher Stevenson, read his Essay on "Climate; its Varieties; and Influence on Man and Organic Nature;" for which the Douglas Gold Medal had been awarded to the author.

Thomas Archer Gregory, A. B., formerly Scholar and Medalist, (M. D. of the Universities of New York and Edinburgh,) was admitted to the degree of Master of Arts, and John Fletcher Stevenson, late Scholar and Librarian, to that of Bachelor of Arts.

In presenting the Medal to Mr. Stevenson, the Principal expressed the sense which he entertained of the Essay, as creditable alike to the author and his College, containing abundant and well digested information, and distinguished by scientific accuracy.

Mr. Thomas Walker is elected Scholar and Librarian; and Mr. William Carleton Lee, who had recently gained the Douglas Silver Medal, is admitted Scholar for the Collegiate School and County of York.

The Chancellor proposes as the subject of Essays in competition for the Gold Medal of the ensuing year:—

"The Harmony of the Animal, Vegetable, and Mineral Kingdoms of Nature."
