LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER,

21st April, 1854.

Resolved, unanimously, That from and after the close
of the present Session, no Grant of Money to any Parish
School Teacher will be assented to by this House, un-
less the same be recommended by the Board of Educa-
tion, whether the service be performed before or since
the passing of the Act 15 Victoria, Chapter 40.

Resolved, That no Bill, Resolution, or other proceed-
ings founded upon any application addressed to the
House of Assembly, be sustained by the Council, unless
an application to the same effect, with such documents
as may accompany the same, be also presented to the
Council in General Assembly.
