

mon Prayer be openly used other than what is prescribed or appointed to be used in and by the said Book, it is notwithstanding provided, that in all those Prayers, Litanies, and Collects which do anywise relate to the King, Queen, or Royal Progeny, the Names be altered and changed from Time to Time, and fitted to the present Occasion, according to Direction of lawful Authority: Her Majesty was pleased this day in Council to declare Her Royal Will and Pleasure, That in all the Prayers, Litanies, and Collects for the Royal Family the words "The Prince Consort" be inserted instead of the words "The Prince Albert."

And Her Majesty doth strictly charge and command, That no Edition of the Common Prayer be from henceforth printed but with this Amendment; and that in the meantime, till Copies of such Edition may be had, all Parsons, Vicars, and Curates within this Realm do (for the preventing of Mistakes,) with the Pen, correct and amend all such Prayers in their Church Books, according to the foregoing Directions: And for the better Notice hereof, that this Order be forthwith printed and published, and sent to the several Parishes; and that the Right Reverend the Bishops do take care that Obedience be paid to the same accordingly.

**W**HEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of March 1857, pass thirty nine Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 2526. An Act to alter and amend Chapter 22, Title iii, of the Revised Statutes, "Of Sick and Disabled Seamen."

No. 2527. An Act for the Election of Members to serve in the General Assembly.

No. 2528. An Act relating to Railways in this Province.

No. 2529. An Act to alter and amend an Act intituled *An Act to authorize the construction of Railways in this Province.*

No. 2530. An Act to alter the time of holding the Circuit Court in the County of Charlotte.

No. 2531. An Act for the payment of costs in proceedings instituted on behalf of the Crown in matters relating to the Revenue, and for the amendment of the Practice in the Court of Exchequer.

No. 2532. An Act to repeal the existing Laws relating to the granting of Mill Reserves in this Province.

No. 2533. An Act to repeal an Act to provide for the more effectually repairing the Roads and Bridges in the Parishes of Campo Bello and Grand Manan, so far as it relates to the Parish of Grand Manan.

No. 2534. An Act to erect the eastern part of the Parish of Pennfield, in the County of Charlotte, into a separate Town or Parish.

No. 2535. An Act to amend an Act to divide the Parish of Carleton, in the County of Kent, into two Parishes.

No. 2536. An Act to authorize the division of the Parish of Sheffield into two Parishes.

No. 2537. An Act to regulate the Road Tax of Non-Residents on Property situate on Islands in the River Saint John.

No. 2545. An Act to empower the Rector, Church Wardens and Vestry of Saint Paul's Church, in the Parish of Hampton, in King's County, to sell and convey certain Lands in the Parishes of Hampton and Upham, and invest the proceeds in securities for the benefit of the Clergy and Parish.

No. 2546. An Act relating to the Public Burial Grounds in the Parish of Saint Stephen.

No. 2547. An Act to authorize the Directors of the Saint John Seamen's Friend Society to wind up and close the affairs of the said Society.

No. 2548. An Act to incorporate the Saint John Harmonic Society.

No. 2549. An Act to incorporate the Hillsborough Mill and Manufacturing Company.

No. 2550. An Act to incorporate the Chatham Gas Light Company.

No. 2561. An Act to amend an Act intituled *An Act to incorporate the Lacote Lake River Driving Company.*

No. 2562. An Act in further amendment of an Act intituled *An Act to incorporate the Northumberland Straits Fishing Company.*

No. 2563. An Act to alter and amend the second Section of an Act intituled *An Act to incorporate sundry persons by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Shediac Bank.*

No. 2564. An Act in amendment of an Act intituled *An Act to incorporate the Saint John Protestant Orphan Asylum.*

No. 2565. An Act in addition to an Act intituled *An Act to incorporate the Saint John Suspension Bridge Company.*

And whereas the said Acts have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with a letter from the Right Honorable Henry Labouchere, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to the Lord President of the Council, recommending that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said Report: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
