NEW BRUNSWICK AND CANADA**RAILWAY AND LAND COMPANY.**

EXTRACT from the Minutes of the Board Meeting of the Saint Andrews and Quebec Railroad Company, attended by the Delegates from the New Brunswick and Canada Railway and Land Company, on the seventeenth day of October A. D. 1856:—

"It is hereby mutually understood and agreed upon between the Board of Directors of the Saint Andrews and Quebec Railroad Company and Josiah Bates, as the Agent and Delegate, and John W.
