

NEW BRUNSWICK AND CANADA
RAILWAY AND LAND COMPANY.

EXTRACT from the Minutes of the Board Meeting of the Saint Andrews and Quebec Railroad Company, attended by the Delegates from the New Brunswick and Canada Railway and Land Company, on the seventeenth day of October A. D. 1856:—

"It is hereby mutually understood and agreed upon between the Board of Directors of the Saint Andrews and Quebec Railroad Company and Josiah Bates, as the Agent and Delegate, and John W. Byrne, the Secretary of the Transferee Company, that Stock in that Company shall be allotted to the Class B Shareholders, in exchange for the Stock now held by them, provided application be made by the individual Stockholders or their representatives, for such exchange of Stock, within two months after notice published in the Royal Gazette of this Province, of the readiness of the Transferee Company to issue Certificates to the Stockholders: That the application for such exchange of Stock must be for the same number of Shares as are now held by the applicant, the amount already paid in by each Stockholder to be considered as so much paid in on the new Stock, and no further calls to be made until an equal amount has been called in from the other Shareholders and paid up by them; the new Stock so to be issued to be entitled to no portion of the facilities granted to the Company, nor to any interest on calls during the construction of the Road, but to be placed on the same footing as the Stock issued to the Provincial Government."

IN PURSUANCE of the above agreement, which was duly ratified and confirmed at a Board Meeting of the Directors of the said New Brunswick and Canada Railway and Land Company held in London on the tenth day of December, A. D. 1856;—
