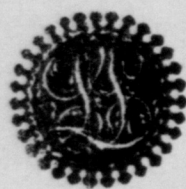

## GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

**P**UBLIC Notice is hereby given, That since the passing of the Act 15 Victoria, Chapter 26, "to enable Her Majesty to carry into effect arrangements made with Foreign Powers for the apprehension of Seamen who desert from their Ships," Orders have from time to time been passed by Her Majesty in Council, and published in the London Gazette, for the apprehending and delivering up, in the British Dominions and in the Territories of the East India Company, of Seamen, deserters from the Merchant Shipping, of the undermentioned Powers, viz:—

Austria, Belgium, Bremen, Chili, Denmark, France, Hamburg, Hanover, Lubec, Mecklenburgh Schwerin, Netherlands, Oldenburgh, Peru, Prussia, Russia, Sardinia, Sicilies, and Sweden and Norway.

**T**HE attention of Parties wishing to be employed as Teachers in the Parish Schools, is called to the following Extract from page 15 of the new Regulations:—

"2. Licences to teach will be granted by the Board as of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd Class, agreeably to the periodical classifications of the Teachers and Candidates, made by the Board on the Reports from the Training School, to such applicants as shall have attended that Establishment, been finally examined there, and received the necessary certificates of character and competency."

The Training School, which is removed for the present to the Premises occupied by Mr. William Mills, in Saint John, will re-open on Monday next, 2nd August. Application for admission must be made to Mr. Mills, who has been appointed Training Master.

## GURRY GROUNDS AT GRAND MANAN.

**P**UBLIC Notice is hereby given, That in addition to the Gurry Grounds previously designated, viz: at Big Duck Island and Buck's Rock, the bounds of which (having been published in the Royal Gazette) are well known, a "Gurry Ground" has been laid out at the North Head, comprised within the limits of a line running in range with the North Head School House, the Dutch Ledges, and the Shore, commencing at a point on said line from which the new Meeting House bears due west; thence southerly along the said line until the Seal Ledges, so called, also bear west, being a distance of about half a mile, and extending one third of a mile from the Shore.

Any person depositing Gurry on other than the above mentioned Grounds, (excepting at half-tide, the usual place of deposit for Boat Fishermen,) will be prosecuted as the Law directs.
