WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of April 1858, pass an Act which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 2593. An Act relating to the Action of Ejectment.

And whereas the said Act has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with a Letter to the Lord President of the Council from the Right Honorable Sir Edward Bulwer Lytton, Bt., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, stating that he considers that under Section 19 of the said Act, the rights of the Crown with regard to Lands reserved for Military purposes might be injuriously affected, and therefore recommending that Her Majesty might be pleased to disallow the same, Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare Her disallowance of the said Act, and the same is hereby disallowed accordingly: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
