## EDUCATION OFFICE,

Fredericton, June 1st, 1859.

**T**HE School Trustees and Teachers throughout the Province, are hereby notified, that the Schools in the different Districts, will be visited by the several Inspectors, during the present Term, in the following order:—

### EASTERN DISTRICT.—Inspector DUVAL.

*King's.*—The Inspector expects to visit the western Parishes of this County in June, and the eastern Parishes at the end of the Term.

### WESTERN DISTRICT.—Inspector M'LAUCHLAN.

*Carleton.*—In July.

*Sunbury.*—In September.

### SOUTHERN DISTRICT.—Inspector CAMPBELL.

*Charlotte.*—Grand Manan, Campo Bello, and West Isles, already visited; remaining Parishes of this County to be visited in August and September.

*Queen's.*—In June.

*Saint John.*—In July & August.

### NORTHERN DISTRICT.—Inspector BENNET.

*Kent.*—The Inspector will visit this County in June, in the following order:—Carleton, Palmerston, Richibucto, Weldford, Wellington, and Dundas.

*Northumberland.*—About the 18th July, in the following order:—Hardwicke, Glenelg, Chatham, Nelson, Blackville, Blissville, Ludlow, Northesk, Newcastle, and Aluwick.

*Gloucester.*—About the 1st September, commencing with Saumarez, Inkerman, Shippegan, Caraquet, New Bandon, Bathurst, Beresford.

*Restigouche.*—About the 21st September, commencing with Durham, Colborne, Dalhousie, Addington.

Any material alteration in the above arrangements will be notified.

In addition, Teachers' Meetings and public Educational Meetings will be held by the Chief Superintendent during the present month, at Gagetown in Queen's; at Moncton and Bay de Verte in Westmorland; at Hillsborough and Hopewell in Albert; and in Saint John. Similar meetings will be held during the season in all the other Counties, of which due notice will be given.

## POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT.

Fredericton, 6th July, 1859.

**P**ART 9, Section 2, of Post Office Regulations is repealed, and the following adopted, viz:—

Printed Books, Periodical Publications or Pamphlets, under sixteen ounces in weight, can be forwarded by Post in New Brunswick, at the rate of one half penny per ounce.

Printed Music will be allowed to pass through Post in New Brunswick, under the same Regulations as Pamphlets.

Printed Circulars, Catalogues, Hand Bills, and Prices Current posted in New Brunswick, will be liable to a rate of one half penny each, subject to the following Regulations, viz:—

The Postage must be prepaid. Each must be in a Cover unsealed, or if sealed, open at the end or side,—the word "Circular," "Catalogue," "Hand Bill," or "Price Current," as the case may be, must be written or printed on the face of the Cover, and each Package must weigh under half an ounce.

Any of the above mentioned, however, coming into New Brunswick by Post from the United States, Canada, Nova Scotia, or Prince Edward Island, will be subject to one half penny Postage, to be collected on delivery, and must be taxed accordingly.
