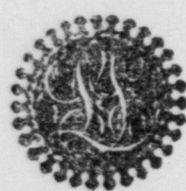

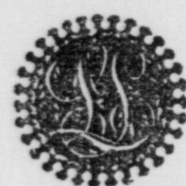
A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION.
