THE School Trustees and Teachers throughout the Province, are hereby notified, that the Schools in the different Districts, will be visited by the several Inspectors, during the present Term, in the following order:—

Gloucester.—About the 1st September, commencing with Saumarez, Inkerman, Shippegan, Caraque, New Bandon, Bathurst, Beresford.
