

## DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

Fredericton, March 15, 1859.

REV. AND DEAR BRETHREN,

At the late Meeting of the General Committee of the Diocesan Church Society, holden in Saint John, it was decided by a majority of at least three fourths of the Members present, that the Annual Meetings of the Society should be held in the beginning of July, instead of in January, or February, as heretofore.
