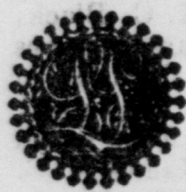

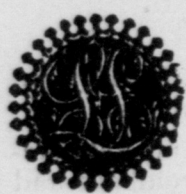
A PROCLAMATION.
