WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Tuesday the fourteenth day of June instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the twenty first day of July next.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine, and in the twenty second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of April 1859, pass an Act, which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :—

No. 2645. An Act to provide a contribution towards the expense of maintaining the Cape Race Light.

And whereas the said Act has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with a letter to the Lord President of the Council from the Right Honorable Sir Edward Bulwer Lytton, Bt., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, recommending that the said Act should be left to its operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve such recommendation; Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NORTHERN DISTRICT.—Inspector BENNET.

Kent.—The Inspector will visit this County in June, in the following order :—Carleton, Palmerston, Richibucto, Weldford, Wellington, and Dundas.

Northumberland.—About the 18th July, in the following order :—Hardwicke, Glenelg, Chatham, Nelson, Blackville, Blissville, Ludlow, Northesk, Newcastle, and Alnwick.

Gloucester.—About the 1st September, commencing with Saumarez, Inkerman, Shippegan, Caraquet, New Bandon, Bathurst, Beresford.

Restigouche.—About the 21st September, commencing with Durham, Colborne, Dalhousie, Addington.

Any material alteration in the above arrangements will be notified.

In addition, Teachers' Meetings and public Educational Meetings will be held by the Chief Superintendent during the present month, at Gagetown in Queen's; at Moncton and Bay de Verte in Westmorland; at Hillsborough and Hopewell in Albert; and in Saint John. Similar meetings will be held during the season in all the other Counties, of which due notice will be given.
