I [state place of residence and description] do swear that I am the Importer (or Owner) or (authorized by the Importer or Owner) to make this Entry and Affidavit; that the several quantities therein are correctly stated; that all the articles contained in the several packages are correctly described therein in accordance with the Tariff, and that the same cost and no more; that the same is the true invoice price of the said goods set forth in this Entry at the place whence they are imported; and I do verily believe such invoice price to be the true and correct value thereof; also that the Invoice or Invoices now produced by me are the original and real Invoices of such goods: I also swear that nothing has been concealed or suppressed in this Entry whereby to avoid the just payment of the duties imposed by the Laws of this Province, and that all matters are justly and truly expressed and set forth herein. THE following Rules and Regulations have been made and passed by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS

For the protection of the Fisheries on the Sea Coasts and around the Islands in the County of Charlotte.

1. That no person shall set any net, or cast or draw any seine, or otherwise catch any fish from sunset on Saturday until sunrise on the following Monday morning, on the sea coast or around the Islands in the County of Charlotte, between low water mark and three marine miles from the shore, under a penalty of ten pounds for each offence, or imprisonment for ten days.

2. That whenever the Fish Warden may determine that gates in fish weirs are necessary, the owner or owners of such weirs, or person using the same, shall cause the said gates to be kept open from sunset on Saturday until sunrise on the following Monday morning, under a penalty of fifteen pounds for each offence.

3. That no person shall set any line or lines on which are placed hooks to catch fish, within three marine miles of the said Coasts or Islands, under a penalty of fifteen pounds, or ten days imprisonment for each offence.

4. That the third Regulation shall not apply to catching fish by hand lines in the hands of the Fishermen at the time.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

For Mining Licences to be granted under the Act 18 Victoria, Chapter 76, approved by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor with the advice of the Executive Council.

1st.—The rent or Royalty upon Coal or Shale to be one shilling per chaldron, (with the exception of that to be raised from lands formerly under lease to Berton, Maynard, and Syphers, where the rate is to be two shillings per chaldron.) Upon Copper two and a half per cent. upon the value, and upon all other minerals five per cent. upon the value thereof.

2nd.—On prepayment of a fee of five dollars, licence to be granted to the owner of the soil, or his assignee, for Coal or Shale for a period not exceeding twenty five years, and for other minerals for a period of not exceeding fifty years.

3rd.—The rent or Royalty to be paid quarterly on the first day of February, May, August, and November in each year, to the Receiver General, or an Agent for that purpose to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. The statements on which such payments are to be made to be on oath.
