

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been made known to me that there exists in the United States a grievous and contagious distemper of a very serious nature among Horned Cattle, I do hereby call upon and require the various local Authorities and all Officers and Ministers of the Law, and all other liege Subjects of Her Majesty, to aid in preventing the introduction of such disease into this Province, and to adopt all such measures as the Law authorizes for that purpose, and for the immediate destruction of Cattle affected with the said disease, if any should be found within the Province.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the twenty seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

CROWN LAND OFFICE, June 5, 1860.

THE undermentioned Lots of Crown Lands will be offered for sale by Public Auction on Tuesday the third day of July next, at noon, by the respective Deputies, at their Offices, agreeably to the Regulations of 30th August 1858, and no sale on credit will be made to any person who is indebted to the Crown for previous purchases.

(Not to interfere with the right to cut Timber or other Lumber under Licences applied for previous to the applications for the purchase of the Land.)

(No person is allowed to hold more than one hundred acres payable by instalments.)

(In all cases of competition, the purchaser must immediately pay the purchase money, or else the Land will be again forthwith offered for sale, excluding bids from the defaulter.)
