RESOLVED, That the 34th Standing Order of this House be rescinded, and in lieu thereof, the following be adopted:—

34th Rule.—That no Bill of a private or local nature shall be entertained by the House unless such Bill has been previously published four weeks successively in some one

of the Newspapers published in the City and County interested in such Bill; and when no Newspaper is published in such County, in some Newspaper published in the nearest adjoining County, or in the Royal Gazette; and that 25 copies thereof be furnished to the Clerk of this House for the use of Members.

Further Resolved, That the above Rule be published in the Royal Gazette three months previously to the sitting of the Legislature.
