



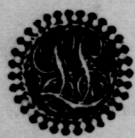

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty ninth day of November instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the third day of January next.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the twenty first day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of April 1860, pass three Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 2727. An Act in addition to and in amendment of an Act passed in the 23rd year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act imposing Duties for raising a Revenue."

No. 2731. An Act to amend Chapter 19, Title iii, of the Revised Statutes 'Of Buoys and Beacons.'

No. 2751. An Act relating to the Militia Law.

And whereas the said Acts have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with a Letter to the Lord President of the Council from the Most Noble the Duke of Newcastle, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, recommending that the said Acts should be left to their operation; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said recommendation: Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being, of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
