

The following Royal Salutes will then be fired from the Garrison Guns at Saint John:—

One Royal Salute from Partridge Island on the approach of Her Majesty's Ship with the Royal Standard flying.

One Royal Salute from the Shore Batteries on the approach to the anchorage.

Simultaneous Salutes will be again fired from Partridge Island and the Shore Batteries on the landing of His Royal Highness.

Similar Salutes will be fired on the departure of His Royal Highness from Saint John to Fredericton.

Similar Salutes will again be fired on the final departure of His Royal Highness from New Brunswick.

Similar simultaneous Salutes will be fired by the Militia Artillery.

His Royal Highness will be received on his landing at Saint John, by a Guard of Honor furnished by the Companies of Militia which have volunteered for drill and exercise; the remainder of which Companies will line the approach to the Wharf, connecting with the Civil Companies and Societies, by whom the Streets to Mrs. Chipman's residence will be lined, in accordance with arrangements made by the Civil Authorities.

His Royal Highness will be received at his residence by a Guard of Honor furnished by the 63rd Regiment.

FOR FREDERICTON.

On the Steamer with His Royal Highness on board being sighted, two guns will be fired in quick succession by the Militia Artillery.

On the approach of the Steamer, a Royal Salute will be fired by the same Corps. A similar Salute will be fired by the same Corps on the landing of His Royal Highness. His Royal Highness will be received on landing by a Guard of Honor furnished by the Companies of Militia which have volunteered for drill and exercise.

The Troop of Yeomanry Cavalry will be drawn up on the Road leading to the Wharf, and will escort His Royal Highness to Government House.

His Royal Highness will be received at Government House by a Guard of Honor furnished by the 63rd Regiment.

The Royal Artillery will fire a Royal Salute on the arrival of His Royal Highness at Government House.

Similar Salutes will be fired by the Royal Artillery and Militia Artillery on the departure of His Royal Highness from Fredericton.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been made known to me that there exists in the United States a grievous and contagious distemper of a very serious nature among Horned Cattle, I do hereby call upon and require the various local Authorities and all Officers and Ministers of the Law, and all other liege Subjects of Her Majesty, to aid in preventing the introduction of such disease into this Province, and to adopt all such measures as the Law authorizes for that purpose, and for the immediate destruction of Cattle affected with the said disease, if any should be found within the Province.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Fredericton, the twenty seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
