

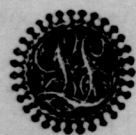

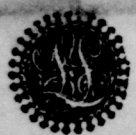
A PROCLAMATION.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS sundry Fires have recently occurred in the City of Fredericton, which Fires are suspected to have been the work of Incendiaries; and whereas the Mayor of the City has offered a Reward of One Hundred Pounds for the discovery of the offenders, I do publish this Proclamation, and offer a Free Pardon to any Person connected with any such act of incendiarism, (except the person who has actually set fire to any Building,) who will give information which shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the Incendiaries, or of any one of them.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

INTENDING Applicants for Land under the Labour Act, are hereby notified that article No. 4 of the existing Regulations has been this day rescinded, and the following substituted in its stead:—

4th. No Petition shall be received at the Crown Land Office until the allegations therein set forth be first verified on oath before a Justice of the Peace, and no approval shall continue in force longer than one year from its date, unless the applicant shall sooner have paid in labour or money, at least one fourth part, together with the Commission, and have cleared at least two acres of the land.
