

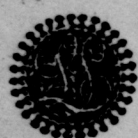

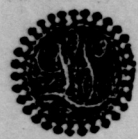
### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of March and April, 1860, pass eighty eight Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz:—

No. 2708. An Act relating to the mode of Accounting and Currency.

No. 2709. An Act to provide for the prompt payment of all demands upon the Provincial Treasury.

No. 2710. An Act to provide for the attendance and examination on oath of Witnesses before the Legislature or Committees thereof.

No. 2711. An Act in amendment of the Law relating to Courts of Probate.

No. 2712. An Act to empower the County Council of the County of York to raise a sum of money for Agricultural purposes.

No. 2713. An Act to amend an Act intituled "An Act for establishing and maintaining a Police Force in the Town of Chatham, in the County of Northumberland."

No. 2714. An Act to repeal an Act intituled "An Act to make further provisions for the support of Buoys and Beacons in the Bay and Harbour of Miramichi."

No. 2715. An Act to amend an Act intituled "An Act for the establishing and maintaining a Police Force in the Parish of Portland, in the City and County of Saint John."

No. 2716. An Act to amend the Act relating to Highways, so far as relates to the Parish of Portland, in the City and County of Saint John.

No. 2717. An Act to authorize the enclosing and improving of King's and Queen's Squares, in Carleton, in the City of St. John.

No. 2718. An Act relating to Taxation on the several Parishes of the City and County of Saint John.
