# MILITIA GENERAL ORDERS.

FREDERICTON, January 24, 1860.

IS Excellency the Commander in Chief is pleased to notify to the Officers commanding Regiments and Battalions of Militia, that Arms (Enfield Rifles) and Accoutrements will be issued to all Companies of the Regiments or Battalions under their respective commands, which have volunteered or may volunteer for drill and exercise.

The conditions on which these Arms and Accoutrements will be served out are as follows:—That the Officers of each Company so volunteering for drill and execreise, give Bonds (vide Article No. 2,) for the money-value of the said Arms and Accoutrements, and also for their good and safe keeping.

These Arms being of a superior description require much care and caution in their use.

An annual inspection will be made of all Arms and Accoutrements so issued.

## No. 2.-FORM OF BOND.

KNOW all men by these presents, That we, and Province of New Brunswick, are held and firmly bound unto our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, &c. in the sum of pounds of lawful money of the said Province, to be paid to our said Lady the Queen, Her Heirs or Successors; for which payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, and every one of us by himself, for and in the whole our and every of our Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, firmly by these presents. Rifles and Sets of Accoutrements have Whereas for the use of been delivered to Company of County Militia, and have agreed that Battalion of the said Rifles and Accoutrements shall be safely kept whilst in their possession, and returned to the Queen's Store in 01 delivered in good order and condition, ordinary wear and tear ex-cepted, to such person or persons as the Commander in Chief for the time being shall appoint to receive the same, when called upon therefor, or when required by the Commander in Chief, or by such person or persons as he shall appoint to receive the same, or

shall pay at and after the rate of four pounds five shillings currency, for each and every Rifle, and fifteen shillings currency for each and everyset of Accoutrements, which shall not so safely keep and return in good order and condition, ordinary wear and tear excepted, when so called upon or required as aforesaid.
