



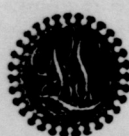

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the first day of August next, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the fifth day of September next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty fourth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty one, and in the twenty fifth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MILITIA GENERAL ORDERS.

FREDERICTON, August 26, 1861.

HIS Excellency the Commander in Chief hereby informs the Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, and Privates, who may, under the Regulations published in the Royal Gazette of the 10th ult., be entitled to compete for "The Prince of Wales' Challenge Cup," that the place of competition will be near the Railroad Station, Sussex Vale, and that 'The Firing' will commence precisely at eleven o'clock, A. M. on Wednesday, October the 2nd, and continue (with the necessary intermissions) until the successful competitor be proclaimed.

2nd. His Excellency the Commander in Chief has been pleased to appoint Lieutenant Reade, Her Majesty's 62nd Regiment, whose services have been placed at the disposal of His Excellency for this purpose by Major General Trollope, Commander of Her Majesty's Troops in this District, to act as Umpire on this occasion.

3rd. Arrangements having been made with the Commissioners of Railways for the free passage of all competitors travelling by Railroad, to and from the place of competition, His Excellency desires to direct the particular attention of all concerned to the following Regulations, a violation of any of which, or of any of those issued in General Orders of the 10th ult. will render the intending competitor ineligible.

1st. That every intending competitor shall bring with him a Certificate from the Officer commanding his Company, giving his name and rank, and stating that he is one of those selected from his Company to compete for 'The Cup.'

2nd. That he shall appear in the full Uniform of the Company to which he belongs.

3rd. That he shall appear on the firing ground for preliminary inspection, with his Rifle in good order, precisely at half past ten o'clock, A. M. on Wednesday, the 2nd of October next.
