MILITIA GENERAL ORDERS.

FREDERICTON, February 13, 1861.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief desires to express his satisfaction at the soldier-like appearance and conduct of that portion of the Militia Force of the County of York, which took part in the customary Military ceremonies at the opening of the Legislative Session, on Tuesday the 12th instant; and His Excellency requests the Officers on duty on that occasion, to communicate this Order to the Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of their respective Corps.

2. Officers, Non-Commissioned, or Men, belonging to any Company of Militia volunteering for Drill and Exercise, who may desire to obtain a transfer from the Company to which they belong, to any other Company, will make application in writing through the Officer in command of their Company, who, if he approve of such transfer, will forward the application to Head Quarters for the consideration of His Excellency the Commander in Chief.

3. His Excellency the Commander in Chief desires to obtain reliable data with respect to the Officers and Men belonging to the several Companies of Militia volunteering for Drill and Exercise, who may be qualified to compete for the Cup to be given by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales; directs all Officers commanding Companies to whom Ball Cartridge has been issued for Practice, to forward without delay, to the Adjutant General, Returns shewing the results of their several Target Practices.
