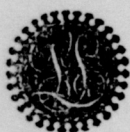

## MILITIA GENERAL ORDERS.

No. 1. FREDERICTON, Sept. 10, 1861.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief, hereby announces that the Lieutenant Governor and Council has offered a Prize for competition, by Members of the Active Local Military Forces of Canada, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, and this Province.

The place of competition will be Sussex Vale, in the Province of New Brunswick. The Firing will commence on the third day of October next. The number of competitors from each Province must not exceed twenty of all Ranks. Each competitor from Canada, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island, will bring with him a Certificate from the Adjutant General of the Militia to which he may belong, giving his Name, Rank, and the Regiment or Battalion to which he may be attached. The competitors on the part of New Brunswick will be the twenty Members of the Companies of the Militia of the Province volunteering for Drill and Exercise, who have made the best 'Firing' for His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales' Cup on the preceding day. All competitors will appear in the Uniforms of the Corps to which they respectively belong. The Prize will be competed for with the long Enfield Rifle, and the regulated allowance of ammunition.
