### MILITIA GENERAL ORDERS.

Head Quarters, Fredericton, 7th June, 1862.

HE following letter from His Exployery the Lieutenant Governor of Prince Edward Island, has been received by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief, and is published by His Excellency's orders for the information of those members of the Militia Force who may be desirous of competing.

(Copy.)

Government House, Prince Edward Island, 27th May, 1862.

SIR,—I have the honor to inform Your Excellency that the House of Assembly of this Colony voted, last Session, a sum of money for the purchase of a Silver Cup to be competed for by the Volunteer Riflemen of the Lower Provinces. The Silver Cup has been ordered from England.

The competition will take place at Charlottetown early in the month of August.

Further particulars of detail will be communicated to Your Excellency, but as far as local circumstances will admit, the same arrangements as were adopted at Sussex Vale last year, will regulate, here, the number of competitors from each Province,—the ranges, and the number of rounds to be fired by each competitor.

I trust that the Volunteers under your Excellency's command may be represented at this competition.

It will also afford myself and the Volunteers of this Colony great satisfaction could Your Excellency honor the meeting with your presence.
