Adjutant General has received the following Bye Laws and Regulations from the Adjutant General of Prince Edward Island, which are published for information.

The following are the Bye Laws and Regulations for the Prize meeting of the Volunteers, to compete for the Silver Cup granted by the Legislature of Prince Edward Island in the Session of 1862.

I. The competition will take place at or near Charlottetown, early in the month of August next, and shall be open to 20 bona fide enrolled Volunteers from each of the Colonies of Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward Island.
