

II. All Volunteers competing for the Silver Cup shall be required to appear in the uniform of their corps.

III. There shall be three ranges, viz :—A, 200 yards,—B, 300 yards,—C, 400 yards. The shooting at range A shall be off the shoulder, at the two remaining ranges of B and C, any position, but no fixed artificial rest shall be allowed.

IV. The size of the targets will be the same as laid down in the Army Musketry Regulations.

V. The competition shall be restricted to Long Enfield Rifles of bona fide government pattern, as used by the rank and file of the volunteer force of this Colony.

VI. None but government ammunition, as supplied on the ground from the government magazine, shall be used.

VII. Any competitor found using a different description of ammunition, shall forfeit all claim to the prize.

VIII. Each competitor shall fire five shots at each of the ranges, A, B, C; and the prize shall be adjudged according to the aggregate number of points thus made.

IX. In case of a tie, each competitor shall fire one shot at the last range, C, until the best shot be returned.

EDUCATION OFFICE,

FREDERICTON, 28th May 1862.

AT a Meeting of the Board of Education held on the 24th day of May instant, the following Orders were passed :—

1. That from and after the first day of July next, the average daily attendance of Pupils at each and every School in rural Districts must be at least ten, and at each and every School in the Cities, Towns and Villages named below, the average daily attendance must be at least seventeen, to entitle the Teachers of such Schools to the Provincial allowance.

2. That from and after the first day of July next, all Teachers be required to attest the accuracy of their School Returns by Affidavit, to be made before any Justice of the Peace.
