WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty seventh day of November instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Tuesday the sixth day of January next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty two, and in the twenty sixth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PRESENT :

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty,

Lord President, Viscount Palmerston, Lord Stanley, of Alderley.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the months of April 1861 and April 1862, pass four Acts, which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :—

No. 2820. An Act to impose a Tax on unimproved Granted Lands, to provide a fund for opening of Roads and building Bridges in the Parishes in which the Lands lie.

No. 2864. An Act in addition to and in amendment of the Acts imposing Duties for raising a Revenue, and in amendment of an Act passed in the nineteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to levy an Impost for Railway purposes."

No. 2867. An Act to explain an Act passed at the present Session, intituled "An Act in addition to and in amendment of the Acts imposing Duties for raising a Revenue, and in amendment of an Act passed in the nineteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled 'An Act to levy an Impost for Railway purposes.'"

No. 2889. An Act to explain an Act intituled "An Act to impose a Tax on unimproved granted Lands, to provide a Fund for opening of Roads and building Bridges in the Parishes in which the Lands lie."

And whereas the said Acts have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with Letters to the Lord President of the Council from the Most Noble the Duke of Newcastle, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of

State, recommending that the said Acts should be left to their operation ; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve the said recommendation : Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, with the Council and Assembly of the said Province, did in the month of April 1862, pass an Act, which has been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :—

No. 2935. An Act relating to the Office of Commander in Chief.

And whereas the said Act has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with a Letter to the Lord President of the Council, from the Most Noble the Duke of Newcastle, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, recommending that the said Act should receive Her Majesty special confirmation ; Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare Her special confirmation of the said Act, and the same is hereby specially confirmed, ratified, and finally enacted accordingly : Whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the time being of Her Majesty's Province of New Brunswick, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

CAP. LXXX.

An Act relating to the Office of Commander in Chief.

Section.

Section.

1. Lieut. Governor to be Commander in Chief of Militia.

2. Suspending clause.

Passed 23rd April 1862.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, as follows :—

1. The Lieutenant Governor of this Province shall, by virtue of his office, be Commander in Chief of the Militia during the absence from the Province of the Governor General.

2. This Act shall not come into operation until Her Majesty's Royal approbation shall be thereunto had and declared.

[This Act was specially confirmed, ratified, and finally enacted by an Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the first day of November, 1862.]
