HER Majesty the Queen having desired that no celebration whatever of Her Majesty's Birth Day should this year take place, the usual general Holiday upon the 24th May will not be proclaimed.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor contemplates the substitution, for this year, of a general Holiday upon the 20th June, the anniversary of Her Majesty's accession.
