A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it has been reported to the Government that the late Fire at the Provincial Penitentiary was caused by an Incendiary or Incendiaries, I do therefore publish this Proclamation, and offer a Reward of FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS to any person who shall give such information as will lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who caused the said fire: And I do hereby offer, in addition to the said Reward, a FREE PARDON for the part any accomplice may have taken in setting the said fire, provided he be not the principal, and shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal Incendiary.

## TENDERS FOR A STEAMER IN THE GULF.

PROPOSALS addressed to the Chief Commissioner will be received at the Office of Public Works, Fredericton, until noon of Friday, the 10th of July next, for the following service, DURING A PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS, to commence at the opening of the navigation in the year 1864.

To run a good and well appointed sea-going Steamer, adapted both for the Carrying Trade and the conveyance of Passengers, of such power, size, speed, and capacity, as may be fully adequate to the required duty, once a fortnight each way between Shediac and Campbellton, touching at the intermediate Ports of Richibucto, Chatham, Newcastle, Bathurst, and Dalhousie; and twice each way every alternate week between Shediac and Newcastle, touching at the intermediate Ports of Richibucto and Chatham.

Each Tender is to specify the size, age, speed, character, and equipment, of the vessel proposed to be used, including the kind and condition of the boilers and machinery; to state the annual sum required for the proposed service, and to furnish a tariff of the rates of Freight and Passage, between the several Ports named, to which the party tendering is willing to be restricted.

The required Steamer is intended to run in connection with the Railway terminating at Shediac, to carry the Mails if so required, and to be under such rules and regulations as to hours of departure, tariff, and other particulars, as the Department may from time to time prescribe.

## UNIVERSITY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

At the Annual Festival of the ENCÆNIA this day celebrated,—

The Douglas Gold Medal was presented to Mr. LUCIUS CAREY ALLISON, of the City of Saint John, author of the Prize Essay on "The rise and progress of the English Empire in India."
