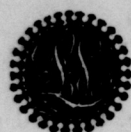
A PROCLAMATION.

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER,

FREDERICTON, April 13, 1864.

This day at eleven o'clock His Honor Colonel JOHN AMBER COLE, Administrator of the Government came to the Council Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, commanded the attendance of the House of Assembly, who being come, His Honor was pleased to close the Session with the following SPEECH:—
