LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER. WEDNESDAY, 4th APRIL, 1860.

DESOLVED, That the 34th Standing Order of this House be rescinded, and in lieu thereof the following be adopted :-

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.
