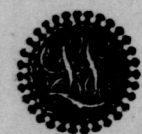

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Her Majesty has been pleased to order, by a notification bearing date the eighth day of September last, that for the future no Ship of War belonging to either of the belligerent powers in North America shall be allowed to enter, or to remain, or be, in any of Her Majesty's Ports for the purpose of being dismantled or sold; and has been further pleased to give directions to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs, and to the Governors of Her Majesty's Colonies and Foreign Possessions, to see that this order is properly carried into effect; I do hereby proclaim and publish this Her Majesty's Order and Command, to the intent that all persons whom it may concern within this Province may govern themselves accordingly.
