HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council offers for Competition to each Battery and Com-pany of Volunteer Militia, a Silver Medal, to be fired for under the following regulations :-

 The best shot of a Battery or Company not to be entitled to the Madel wales the shall have made thirty eight points.

of the Adjutant General, on or before the 30th November, 1865, after which date none can be received; a certificate is also in each case to be sent by the Officer Commanding, to the effect that the competition took place on one fixed day, and on that day only; that it was conducted according to the Hythe Regulations.
